CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 618.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 618 is advanced. LB 617.

CLERK: Madam President, 617 was a bill originally introduced by Senator Conway. (Read title.) Bill was introduced on January 23, referred to the Government Committee, advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending. (See AM2024 as found on page 2425 of the Legislative Journal.) Senator Conway would move to amend the committee amendments, Madam President. Senator, I have AM2139 in front of me. (See AM2139 on page 2506 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Madam President. AM2139 is simply, again, a very technical amendment sent to us by the bill drafter where, and all that it does is rather than describe eight regents elected from districts as provided in Section, and then it gave a section number, they changed that to read "in law", rather than giving a section number. So described in law and also, rather than giving a date specific, it changes the date to the effective date of this act. One other provision, it says, "shall thereafter represent districts" and we've...it's stricken "five" and replaced it in a different situation. So it's simply very technical and it just came down to me but, rather than referencing the section specific, it says "by law", and rather than having the effective date of the act, which was an old effective date of the act giving this date specific, it simply says the effective date of this act. So it's very technical and that's from the bill drafters.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. Does anyone wish to address this amendment? Seeing none, we will vote on the Conway amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of the committee...or the amendment to the committee amendments, as offered by Senator Conway.
