SENATOR CONWAY: In Douglas County, that would, going into District 4 will include a population county of about 22,444.

SENATOR WESELY: Is that right?

SENATOR CONWAY: Yes.

SENATOR WESELY: What's the...

SENATOR CONWAY: Again, I guess it goes back to, maybe a quick explanation is that it goes back to the fact that Douglas-Sarpy County combined basically have had about a 30,000 person growth in the last ten years and therein lies the change for shifts of that size into that county.

SENATOR WESELY: What's the total...what's the deviation populate...? About almost 200,000 so I guess what we're looking at in each district, a little under 200,000.

SENATOR CONWAY: Right, 196, 197, 198 thousand typically are what each district will encompass.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay. Thank you.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Madam President. Got two things on my mind here.
