LB 617, 619

PRESIDENT MOUL: Committee amendments are adopted. Senator Conway, would you like to open on the bill itself?

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Madam President. Now that the committee amendments are adopted, basically, again, the committee amendments are the bill. The Board of Regents has, like I say, been scratched out. There are no incumbents who happen to be in the same district with another incumbent. There has been, again, some adjustment, again, not radically, to the previous maps, but enough that again, in order to pick up those population shifts, we have had some two or three county changes in each of the more rural areas, as well as, again, District 4, which is the southeast corner of the state, now goes up and picks up 22,000 Douglas County residents as well. But that basically is the plan as it's mapped out and I offer it to the body.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. We'll now vote on...does anyone wish to address the bill itself? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to advance LB 617. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 617.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 617 is advanced. I would now like to have the senators' attention directed to the area under the north balcony. Special guests today of Senator Cudaback are his mother, Lena Cudaback, and Sherry Morrow. Would you please rise and be recognized. Welcome to the Chambers today. Thank you. We'll now proceed with LB 619.

CLERK: Madam President, 619 was introduced by Senator Conway. It's a bill for an act relating to redistricting. (Read title.) Introduced January 23, referred to Government, advanced to General File. I have committee amendments pending. (See AM2025 as found on page 2428 of the Legislative Journal.) In addition, Senator Conway would move to amend the committee amendments. Senator, AM2141. (See AM2141 on page 2507 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Madam President. The amendment to
