

term protection to both those individuals and I think that is to their satisfaction relative to what their status will be by having Hall and Sherman County in the same district in the future. And so I offer this to the body for their adoption.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. Does anyone wish to address the committee amendments? Seeing none, we will now vote on the committee amendments. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Government Committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Committee amendments are adopted. Senator Conway, would you like to open on the bill itself?

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Madam President. Really not necessarily open. What we've adopted is, again, the same plan for the board of regents as we have for the State Board of Education. With the adoption of those committee amendments as well as amendments to those committee amendments, we've provided the term protection for the two incumbents that are in the same district and I offer this to the body for their adoption.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. Senator Hefner, do you wish to address this bill?

SENATOR HEFNER: Madam President and members of the body, I have a question of Senator Conway, if he'll yield.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Yes.

SENATOR HEFNER: Senator Conway, the map that we received in this packet, now does this include the committee amendments and also the amendment to the committee amendment?

SENATOR CONWAY: It includes the committee amendments, but, in terms of the pictorial display of the committee amendments, it doesn't have all the language in it naturally, but it shows the committee amendment. So far all the amendments to the committee amendments to date have been just sent down from the bill drafter and they're very technical and wouldn't affect or change the mapping per se. It simply gives clarifying language, like
