SENATOR HEFNER: Okay. Okay, and then I wanted to ask the same question on the previous bill of the board of regents. The amendments that we adopted is the map that's in the packet.

SENATOR CONWAY: Correct.

SENATOR HEFNER: Okay. Thank you.

SENATOR CONWAY: Yes.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator.

SENATOR CONWAY: I should take just a second to clarify. The map that you're looking at in...for the board of regents or the State School Board, because it's so small, when you get into the Omaha area you almost have to look at the bigger map because there was a minor, minor change, but it wouldn't even show up on the print because the change is smaller than the width of the line, but the big map does display it and that's what the language reflects.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: A question of Senator Conway. On this plan, there's another...District 4 as in the regents with part of Lancaster County brought into District 4, how many residents are we talking about in Lancaster County that would be part of that district?

SENATOR CONWAY: Approximately 9,846 residents out of Lancaster County are also in District 4, just 9,800.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Is there anyone else who wishes to address the bill? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Conway? Closing is waived. We'll now vote on the motion to advance LB 619. All those in favor please vote aye, oppose, nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.
