Conway, do you wish to address the bill itself?

SENATOR CONWAY: No, Madam President, again, we discussed I think thoroughly and everyone knows what they're voting on with respect to the congressional plan as it was amended so I ask for the advancement.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Does anyone wish to speak on the motion to advance? Seeing none, we will vote on the motion to advance LB 615. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 1 nay, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 615.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 615 is advanced. Proceed with LB 616.

CLERK: LB 616 was a bill introduced by Senator Conway. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 23, referred to the Government Committee for public hearing, advanced to General File. I have committee amendments pending to the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Mr. Clerk, could you describe to me which one and what order and what they are?

CLERK: Senator, I have...the only amendments I have from you are the committee amendments, 2080 and 2076.

SENATOR CONWAY: 2076?

CLERK: 2076.

SENATOR CONWAY: Okay, I believe I want to go ahead with those. I believe I had on my list that there was an E clause but that apparently is somewhere between now and here in bill drafting. But I will go ahead with the committee amendments and we can work on the additions after that. The amendment as...the committee amendment under LB 616 breaks down the Supreme Court judicial districts into six districts as prescribed. In your packet, you will see the map and you will see the deviations as they are established. I believe that there is another amendment coming up. What the committee did, and it's been kind of a tradition of Supreme Court judicial districts, is to nest the
