

that the line was running west. And so, between the E & R techniques and other specific amendments that will be offered at a later date to make sure that all that language is truly reflective of the map that was intended, there will be some other technical amendments coming but not at this time.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. Mr. Clerk, do you have amendments on the desk?

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Pirsch would move to amend the committee amendments. (The Pirsch amendment appears on pages 2520-21 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Pirsch, your amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Oh. Thank you. Sorry, I was talking. Madam President and members of the Legislature, this is an amendment that is agreed upon by Senator Lynch and I and, as a matter of fact, just restores an eastern boundary to the present line that it is now 60th Street. Streets are permanent and a visible permanent boundary and to describe the little meander around a school just off of 60th Street takes 20 lines in the...in the amendment, the committee amendment. This amendment would just eliminate 10 lines in my description and 10 lines in Senator Lynch, and keep 60th Street as the boundary line, as our mutual boundary line. It's neater. It maintains the present line boundary on 60th Street. It makes negligible difference, if at all, in the body count. I think Senator Lynch said one registered voter. And Senator Lynch supports it. With that, I urge its adoption.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Pirsch. Is there anyone who wishes to speak to the Pirsch amendment? Senator Withem. Senator Crosby. Senator Wesely. Senator Conway.
