

SENATOR CONWAY: Senator Lynch, could you respond to that?

SENATOR LYNCH: Yeah, your own computer system indicated one person, not one registered voter. It's a white house right next to Springville school. I support the amendment offered by Senator Pirsch. We talked about it. It takes in the Springville school because it happened to be precinct lines. But, again, the straight line along 60th Street is permanent. The precinct should probably sometime be changed to represent that street. But the total base on the computer is one live body.

SENATOR CONWAY: So it's just one person and that's not even a net swap, that's just one person total that's registered.

SENATOR LYNCH: And I'm not even sure how they voted in the last two or three elections, to be completely frank.

SENATOR CONWAY: And do note that both Senator Pirsch's district is only a .68 and yours is a negative 1.03, so one person certainly is not going to impact that at all. So I would rise in support and with caution though that we will get confirmation on the specific numbers.

SENATOR LYNCH: Right.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. Senator Lynch, do you wish to speak further? Senator Pirsch, do you have closing on this bill...or amendment? Closing is waived. We will now vote on the Pirsch amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Pirsch's amendment to the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. Do you have further amendments on the desk?

CLERK: Nothing further on the committee amendments at this time, Madam President.
