

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Hall. Discussion on the amendment offered by Senator Hall? Senator Coordsen, did you wish to discuss the amendment? Senator Wehrbein, did you wish to discuss that amendment?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. President and members, just briefly, I will support the Hall amendment. I was going to speak also opposing the amendment, the main amendment, but to clarify what I have perceived to be his intention, I do support the amendment and I think it is necessary to clarify that.

SPEAKER BAACK: Okay, I will ask you just to renew your light and we can do that. Senator Will, did you wish to address the Hall amendment? Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Just to acknowledge that this does get us on the right track, very helpful and does illuminate the underlying theme that Senator Hall has indicated in his line of argument, and it is very helpful to have this. I am grateful and I will be voting for this amendment to the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Seeing no further lights on, Senator Hall, did you wish to close?

SENATOR HALL: I'd move adoption of the amendment, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BAACK: We will now vote on the amendment to the amendment as offered by Senator Hall. Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.
