

committee. They're supported by the industry and so I would tell you that there is, in fact, no constitutional question, no subject matter problem, no content problem with this legislation. The technical amendment offered by Senator Landis is simply that and corrects some errors and some dates on the measure. I don't think there's a problem here.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Senator Haberman, did you wish to discuss this further?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes. Senator Wesely, if you will...Senator Wesely?

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR HABERMAN: LB 419, notwithstanding any other provision of state law regulation, any individual who has met the requirements of subsection (2) of this section shall have the right to use the title "certified nursing assistant". Now, I would like to ask you to explain to me where in 419 it says anything about insurance?

SENATOR WESELY: It's what we call striking the bill and inserting a new bill. That's not the bill anymore, Rex. It's gone. It's out of here.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, then would you agree to the fact that LB 419 has six subjects?

SENATOR WESELY: No, it has one subject.

SENATOR HABERMAN: What's that subject?

SENATOR WESELY: The health insurance issue and insurance in general.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Did we take out the "certified nursing assistant"?

SENATOR WESELY: That's right.

SENATOR HABERMAN: That's taken out?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, that's gone.
