SENATOR ROBINSON: What is the total increase for the two schools? If this were enacted, what would be the...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: It is on the backside of the page, I believe.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah, '90-91.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Metro, it shows an 11.5 or 11.59 percent increase in their growth, 10 percent change. Oh, I see that...I don't have those figures either. Let me get those for you and get back to you. I have my light on.
