

SENATOR MOORE: I've nothing more to add. I just ask for adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: You've heard the motion on the Moore amendment. All in favor vote aye, all opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: I would request a call of the house and I would accept call in votes.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: The question is, shall the house go under call? All in favor vote aye, all opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: The house is under call. All members please report back to the Chamber. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Members, please check in. We are accepting call in votes.

CLERK: Senator Schellpeper voting yes. Senator Schrock voting yes.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: The amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill? The call is raised.

CLERK: Senator Conway, would offer or move to amend the bill, Mr. President. Senator, I have your AM1889 in front of me.
