LB 457A, 582, 701

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 457A passes. We will pass over LB 579 and 579A and go to LB 582.

CLERK: (Read LB 582 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BAACK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 582 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 2654-55 of the Legislative Journal.) 38 ayes, 1 nay, 5 present and not voting, 5 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 582 passes. We'll now go to LB 701. Yes, we will now start to...there is a motion on LB 701 to return it. We will start doing those bills now. We will move to 701 first and then we'll go back to 142 and work our way through the bills that had motions filed on them.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Rasmussen would move to return LB 701 to Select File for a specific amendment. The amendment is found on page 2610 of the Journal.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I would like to move this back to add this amendment which clarifies that this project is a demonstration project and does not create any new permanent services or entitlement to new services. Although we had that dialogue on the floor, there were those that were still concerned and wanted to have it in a section in the bill and so that is the primary thrust of this amendment. There is a second piece that we added in the amendment and that is to say that the Interagency Coordination Council would examine the use of family payment and sliding fee for any new services that might be recommended as a result of this demonstration project. So, with that, I would like to return it to Select File and then would be glad to answer any questions about the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any discussion on the motion to return LB 701? Seeing none, we will vote on the motion to return LB 701. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.
