LB 142, 652, 701

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: The bill is returned. Senator Rasmussen, do you have any further remarks about the amendment?

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: I think it's fairly clear, it's just that the purpose of this is to make it very clear in the bill that this is the demonstration project to demonstrate coordination of and referral...coordination of referral and services and that it would not be a creation of any new services that would go beyond the demonstration project. So, with that, I would urge your adoption of this amendment or I would answer any questions anyone has.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any discussion on the amendment offered by Senator Rasmussen? Seeing none, Senator Rasmussen, do you wish to close? She waives closing. We will now proceed to vote on the amendment offered by Senator Rasmussen. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Rasmussen's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. Senator Will, would you like to move the bill?

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, I move the readvancement of LB 701 to E & R for Grossment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to advance LB 701. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. We will now go back to LB 142.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Moore would move to return the bill for a specific amendment, that amendment being to strike the enacting clause. (The Moore amendment appears on page 2656 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. Speaker and members, this is the oft repeated dialogue on the animal damage predator control bill. You may remember that in LB 652 this Legislature passed on Final Reading yesterday and put over...advanced over to the Governor's desk a level of funding for this program. As I said then, this
