

I hope at that time they take a good look at the fiscal impact of these production credits and I hope they take a good look at the Hastings plant and what has taken place here. I don't understand everything that's taken place in Hastings and I think in this interim study they should take a look at it and come up with some answers for us. I didn't get what I wanted out of this bill. I wanted a two-cent tax credit at the pump after December of 1992. I have sacrificed that. But there is time to address some of these issues next session. And it was clear that we were not going to come to a conclusion on this floor as to what to do with this bill today. And Senator Coordsen wanted to bracket the bill until next session. I said, wait, let's don't do that, there are a couple of things I want out of this bill. I want the clean air amendment which really doesn't affect Nebraska too much because we don't have any nonattainment zones in Nebraska. And I also want the section that strikes the investment authority of the Ethanol Authority, because if all the ethanol plants that are rumored to come to Nebraska come, the Ethanol Authority will be broke, we'll have to introduce a checkoff that will be so astronomical I will have every farmer in the state after my neck. It also has left a section in there about ETBE. It's of very little significance at this time because there is no ETBE being produced or marketed in the state. And if there is, this will have practically no impact on the State of Nebraska, financially speaking. So Senator Coordsen wanted to bracket it and I talked to him and this was the compromise we reached because he also agreed we needed this. And I think there should be a lot of thought given to that study this summer on both what the fiscal impact is going to be of production credits and what has taken place in Hastings. Let's get some answers at that time. And so, with that, I would urge the body to adopt this amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard Senator Schrock's closing on his amendment. We will now vote on that amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: I suppose we'll have to have a call of the house and have a board vote.

SPEAKER BAACK: We'll have to go into a roll call.
