

**SPEAKER BAACK:** We do have objection. Okay, we will continue with the list of speakers. Senator Bernard-Stevens, on the motion to bracket.

**SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS:** Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body, just very briefly, I support the bracket motion. I know it's a very important issue, in fact, it's important to me as well for one of the areas being discussed is one very close to...close to my district, it's very important to the people in that area. **SENATOR CROSBY:** I call the question.
