

SENATOR BEUTLER: ..the failure to build a fence in any particular little section. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Madam President and members, once again we go to the heart of the matter and I don't under...I guess, in my entirety, I assumed that this would be fenced, and I guess that's not a valid conclusion, is that right, Senator Beutler, without this amendment?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Oh, I think that would be fenced.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: You think the trail would be?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Most all trails are fenced, yes. I wouldn't mind a provision that said they had to be fenced...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: But your...so your main...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ..as long as you're not requiring an intruder fence, which, by the way, I don't read this as requiring the necessity of building an intruder fence but simply a legal, we're making a legal decision that it would be deemed an intruder fence. Is that correct now?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: What is your interpretation, Senator Coordsen?

SENATOR COORDSEN: On the intruder fence, yes, that is the reason for this particular language that that fence shall be deemed to be, what design, rather than to build a chain-link and/or the expensive people proof fence.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Your standard here is an intruder fence, then? Is it woven,...

SENATOR COORDSEN: No, the...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ..barbed wire?

SENATOR COORDSEN: ..the railroad law requires I believe a hog, sheep or whatever...
