SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Wehrbein, if I may, would you just read? This amendment is not all that long. Would you just read for me now how your amendment would read, because I can't get...I don't...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ..have access to your amendment.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: It's on page 2070 of the Journal.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And...

SENATOR BEUTLER: And how would it read with your amendment to the amendment?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: With the amendment...if my amendment to the amendment would pass, it would simply be the first part of the sentence there starting: "owners or operators of a trail developed pursuant to the Trail Development Assistance Act shall, at one-half mile intervals along such trail, place signs warning that departures from the boundaries of the trail, as marked by fences or otherwise, may result in prosecution for trespass, period. It strikes the rest of the amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Thank you.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Because, you see, the previous amendment did not pass.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. I would certainly have no objection to the amendment to the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Lynch? Senator Chambers. Does anyone else wish to speak to this amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Wehrbein?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: If everyone understands it, that would conclude my remarks on this and I'd ask for your consideration.
