CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Wehrbein's amendment to his amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. Do you have further opening, Senator Wehrbein?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Madam President and members, simply to say that this simply asks for posted signs every half-mile along the trail. That's simply is all it does and I'd urge consideration of this amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Wehrbein, a question, if I may. I'd certainly be...I would certainly think it would be very appropriate to put such signs at what I would call appropriate entry points along the trail and I know that's a little nebulous to you, but the way you have it now, every half-mile there'd be signs in the middle of a section where no one's coming on or off the trail so it seems to me that that's a bit of harassment. What I would prefer is if you did it every mile, which would be at the entry points of the county roads or, better yet from my point of view, just let us say at appropriate entry points and then for each trail it would be understood from our discourse of what is intended is that wherever there are significant numbers of people getting on and off the trail, or likely to get on and off that particular trail, such a sign would be placed. I mean, that would seem reasonable to me and I'd be willing to compromise it at that immediately.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I would accept that, Senator Beutler. I simply...truly, in my own mind, I'm not sure it's adequate because some times people forget within a mile interval, but I would accept that in the spirit of compromise because I...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ..I recognize that that is the critical part.
