SENATOR BEUTLER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, this amendment would simply conform the Wehrbein amendment to our conversation and put trespass signs at appropriate entry points to be as we discussed, and that would replace the "every half-mile interval" language that's presently in the amendment. Would move the adoption.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Does anyone else wish to speak to this amendment? Seeing none, we will vote on the Beutler amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The Beutler amendment is adopted. Is there anything further on the Wehrbein amendment?

CLERK: Nothing further on the Wehrbein amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Does anyone else wish to speak to the Wehrbein amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Wehrbein? Closing is waived. We'll now vote on the Wehrbein amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. Do you have further amendments on the desk?

CLERK: I now have your amendment, Senator Wehrbein. Page 2, line 15, strike the words "any direct". (See FA190 as found on page 2691 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Wehrbein.
