I wanted to remind you also that on General File we compromised this so that none of these funds could be used to purchase the MoPac Trail, which is in Senator Wehrbein's district, so this is not a question of the MoPac Trail but just as an indication of community support you may have noticed that the money essentially has been raised for the MoPac Trail. The necessary community guarantees have been acquired. I think if you were in this community, or the Omaha community, in a lot of communities outstate, you would find broad-based and ever-growing support for this kind of recreational activity. We've now...we've taken responsibility for fences now. A lot of compromise has been made--trespassing signs. I think the bill is in good order and is a reasonable bill and I pledge to you that in the future, if any kind of problems develop, I don't want problems to develop, we'd be glad to take a look at them, but let's get started with a real program. You know, we're really way behind in terms of what our population wants, in terms of what other states are doing. We have some opportunities here that we're missing and we need to start down the trail. Thank you.
