But I would just remind everyone that when you hear them talking here about the fact that the Department of Revenue allows these games, the Department of Revenue felt that because of the way the statutes read they did not have the authority to specifically say, no, you cannot do this, then what they said instead was, we'll let you test it. It has been tested for one month only in one town in Nebraska. They're not out there now, supposedly, at least not to the knowledge of the Department of Revenue. So I want to make sure you all realize that, that these games that they tested are not out there being played now. They were tested for one month and the department said, after the fact, that there would have to be some changes in the machines, and I think Senator Will already told you about that, in order for them to be acceptable. Now I realize that if we adopt what Senator Hall is trying to do here they won't have to meet those requirements. But the other thing that I want to raise one more time is that we're changing totally what we think of as keno, in what we have allowed as keno, as a game for the cities and the counties across the state to operate. This has not had a public hearing. It is a total new concept which is right next door to video lottery. Now I'm going to give you the remainder of my time, Tim, if you only talk about what I asked you to talk about.

SENATOR HALL: Don't want it.
