

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. Does anyone wish to speak to this amendment? Seeing none, we will vote on the Conway amendment to the Conway amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the amendment to the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. Is there anything further on the bill...on the amendment?

ASSISTANT CLERK: I have nothing further to the Conway amendment, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Is there anyone who wishes to speak to the Conway amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Conway?

SENATOR CONWAY: Okay. Thank you, Madam President. In closing, again what we're talking about is simply the technical amendments that's now been amended with some substantive changes, substantive in terms of as they're designed on the map but not substantive in the sense that they change the statistics and change the ranges. We've checked for that. But in three cases and maybe one that's more salient than others, Senator Robak worked with Senator Dierks and Senator Carson Rogers and they developed a three-way exchange such that Newman Grove, which was in Madison County, or the majority of it is in Madison County but it also has a county line that runs through the middle of it, was all in her district including a little portion of Madison County. Well, through that three-way exchange she was able to move Newman Grove, the community, back to Madison County which, under the Bernard-Stevens plan, would be in Senator Cap Dierks' area and then, through an exchange that he had with Senator Carson Rogers, they were able to get that balance, and so that's what this kind of amendment is. A similar thing with Senator Landis here in Lincoln and Senator Lindsay had another arrangement in Omaha and the like and those three are in there. The rest of it's the technical amendments. But I guess in closing, I do have the microphone and may not get this opportunity again, never knowing how things will develop, I would like to thank my staff who have worked diligently and I, from everything I can tell, very closely with many of you who
