

of community of interest. He's also said that the senators are still residing in their designated areas. That's also true of the map that I have. Those same things hold true for that map. We think...I think that in the interest of good public relations for our state that this map that I've brought to you should be adopted. We have kept...I think we've kept the faith with our people. We have designated Sandhills areas with Sandhills areas. We have designated farm ground with farm ground, urban areas with urban areas, and we haven't made that many changes in the committee plan. Like I say, the main change we've made is we've kept the two districts, 21 and 39, and made them viable districts, and we have eliminated District 43. I urge your support of this amendment. Thank you.

Would the senators please be seated. Senator Elmer, would you please be seated so we can proceed with roll call vote? Please proceed, Mr. Clerk.
