CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2732-33 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 19 nays.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment fails. I will raise the call. Are there further amendments on the desk?

CLERK: Senator Conway would move to amend. (See FA192 as found on page 2733 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Is that the handwritten amendment?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Madam President and members. After drawing the attention to all of you to look very closely at your district, there was a little error in mine that I have known for a long time and when I got to the language realized that it wasn't in the language, and so caught in my own chastisement of people not reading closely, I found one myself. What this amendment simply does is on Legislative District 17, that because of the involvement of the two Indian reservations, the Winnebago Reservation and the Omaha Reservation, the reservation lines do not follow specifically county lines and I found a little tiny corner that hangs out over the top of Burt County that has 32 people in it that actually need to be held intact with the Indian reservation and by describing the way it was in the language it didn't show this little tiny corner that...where the Indian reservation line runs straight and the county line has a little jog. And so there's 32 people who live in that area and so this is to amend that back in to keep the Omaha Indian Reservation intact and totally within a given district. In checking the numbers and running it, we already did that and it's certainly within the tolerances, so I ask the body to support this amendment to the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. Does anyone wish to address this amendment? Seeing none, we will vote on the Conway amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 1 nay, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Conway's amendment.
