to be done. This is one that we ought to work on tomorrow and tomorrow and tomorrow. If the Governor means what Senator Robak has told us he has indicated to her, that we will be in special session June the 6th, that's what it ought to be. His statement should not be construed by us as a threat and it certainly should not be a goad to make us act in a precipitant manner. His giving us that information does not add anything in the way of additional light on the subject. This is the kind of thing which is, in my opinion, the Legislature's direct responsibility. Senator Crosby asked whether anybody is out there listening. And I don't know exactly to whom she was referring but there was some guy who said that the Supreme Court follows the elections, meaning that they read the newspapers, they know who is in office, they know what the realities are that exist in the society and those realities come into play when they make their decisions and render their opinions. If the court decides that they're going to strike down everything that people say will be struck down by the court, that is not the end of the world, it's the beginning of our assuming responsibility. I would like to ask Senator Hall a question.

SENATOR HALL: Yes.
