SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...we're going to get a constitutional amendment that lets us tax only you and then we don't even have to talk about raising the taxes, although that will be the impact of it. Madam President, I would ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT MOUL: I have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 0 nays to under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chambers and record their presence. Would the senators please be seated and please check in. The house is under call. Would the senators please check in. The house is under call. Senator Nelson, Senator Peterson, Senator Robinson, would you please check in. Senator Wesely, Senator Horgan, Senator Rod Johnson. Senator Wesely, please check in. We will proceed with a roll call vote on the Chambers motion to indefinitely postpone LB 186. Senator Peterson, please check in.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2738 of the Legislative Journal.) 3 ayes, 36 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion fails. I will raise the call and we will proceed with debate on LB 186. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Madam President, I would move that LR 186 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.
