

Senator Warner, did you wish to discuss the Smith amendment? Senator Moore, the Smith amendment? Senator Hillman, the Smith amendment? Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: I just rise in support of the Smith amendment to the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Robinson, the Smith amendment? Senator Smith, do you wish to close?

SENATOR SMITH: No.

SPEAKER BAACK: We will now vote on the amendment to the amendment offered by Senator Smith. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the amendment to the amendment. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Smith's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, another amendment to the amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Smith would move to amend. (Read the Smith amendment as found on page 2745 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. This is the language that I discussed earlier which two parts of at least I know. One of them would be to remove the prohibition against special legislation. The second part would remove the prohibition which would grant an extension of the credit by the state which interprets into being able to reimburse Commonwealth and other depositors as an example. And I'm not going to argue this issue. We've talked about this a number of times throughout the years. It is a choice of the people and I think they ought to have that opportunity to vote on this as a separate part of this amendment. Thank you.
