

SENATOR HALL: ...I have no problem with your amendment to strip annually out of line 12.

SENATOR WITHEM: Okay.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Hall, I have another question for you.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Hall, would you answer a question from Senator Robinson?

SENATOR HALL: Yes.

SENATOR ROBINSON: So you are saying with your amendment the Legislature with 25 votes could spend the lottery money on anything, right?

SENATOR HALL: I would think that that would be a fair representation.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay, now without it, what can't they spend money on?

SENATOR HALL: Currently?

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah.

SENATOR HALL: Well, anything that would be determined...well, we can't spend it on depositors, we know that, for one.
