SENATOR SMITH: All right, we're carrying on a conversation here about nothing really. The thing is I'm just going to have to stand to oppose this and Senator Withem said it as well as...better than I can say it right now, and I just will have to oppose this and maybe next year you can come before the committee and provide it to us and we may decide to support you on the floor again. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. President, members, could I ask Senator Chambers a question?

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Chambers, would you respond, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will.

SENATOR LYNCH: Senator Chambers, a couple of months ago I was getting a haircut and it took about an hour and a half because the barber kept answering the phone. And I thought he was making appointments, but they were all for two o'clock on Tuesday. My question is, will that barber have to pay taxes under your amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This amendment does not put in place legalized sports betting. The Legislature would have to enact legislation and at that time we would set up the regulations.
