

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, Senator Withem, what I was hoping was that the discussion of it would make it clear what it's to be. If there were anything else on the bill, I would rewrite it, but I don't know if anything else is on it.

SENATOR WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Clerk, are there any other amendments on that bill?

CLERK: I have one other amendment, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, then I'll withdraw that altogether.

SPEAKER BAACK: It is withdrawn. Next amendment, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Smith would move to amend. (Smith amendment appears on page 2750 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. Speaker and Mr. Clerk, if I recall correctly it's page 2.

CLERK: Line 13 through...

SENATOR SMITH: Yes. We're inserting as we would have attempted to have done in the Hall amendment to make it consistent, we want to add "type of" so that we keep it consistent with the rest of the language for our discussion earlier with the Hall amendment that was withdrawn. That's all we're doing is inserting the two words "type of". The sentence reads, "No lottery game shall be conducted as part of a lottery unless the type of game", so you add "type of" is all. I ask for the adoption of this small amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion, Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body, just to reiterate what Senator Smith said. This is the same amendment that we talked about earlier that clarifies that we are referring in the Constitution to the type of game is what the Legislature has to approve rather than a specific game.
