

the amendment, if we don't do this provision and this amendment is now the bill, there are a lot more things that could have been done under 262 that people wanted to do, such as myself. I can't do them. There are a lot of other things that people don't want 262 to do. If we don't do this, there is a substantial risk that you may have a four-month gap in our tort law. Am I willing to take the risk? No, I am not and that is the purpose for this amendment. Is it unusual because you are here three days before? Yes, it is. Has this amendment been printed in the Journal? Yes, substantially, there are a couple of little changes but this amendment has been in the Journal for several days, at least for people to look at and to read. I would ask for the adoption of this amendment because I think we need to do it now or else we face substantial risk in the future. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you Senator Kristensen. Would the senators please check in. Senator Lamb, Senator Moore, Senator Schellpeper, please check in. We are still looking for Senator Bernard-Stevens. Okay, we will proceed with the vote on the Kristensen amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 3 nays, Madam President on adoption of Senator Kristensen's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. Is there anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Abboud would move to amend.

PRESIDENT MOUL: I will raise the call, by the way. Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABOUD: Yes, Madam President, would the Clerk read the amendment.

CLERK: Strike Section 8 of the Kristensen amendment, AM2253.

SENATOR ABOUD: In the section that we are striking now, the Kristensen amendment has become the bill? I'll answer that question, yes it has. What the...if you will turn to Section 8 of the Kristensen amendment, on page 5 of the amendment, Section 8 runs from page 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9. Section 8 deals with inspections. This particular...actually this entire
