

Okay, there is no one else wishing to speak on the issue, so I'll recognize Senator Smith for closing. Closing is waived. We'll now vote on the Smith amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: I'll ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote, please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 1 nay, to go under call.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. All unexcused senators please return to the Chambers and record your presence. Would the senators please be seated and please check in. The house is under call. Senators Baack, Byars, Lindsay, Moore, would you please check in. Senator Chambers, Senator Pirsch, Senator Rogers, Senator Schimek, Senator Wesely, please check in, and Senator Schrock. Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: I'd like a reverse order on that roll call, please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Looking for Senator Baack. Senator Smith, we're just looking for Speaker Baack. Do you want to proceed? We'll proceed with roll call in reverse order on the Smith amendment.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2789-90 of the Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 10 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The Smith amendment is adopted. I will raise the call. Are there further amendments?

CLERK: Yes, there are. Madam President, Senator Hall would move to amend. Senator, I have AM1546 in front of me.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hall.
