Committee will plan on taking a look at this and sharing in that dialogue. So even though it is not the way the bill originally was introduced, I think it gives us some points to negotiate with the NRC. So I support the bill's advancement.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Johnson. Senator Ashford.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Question.

PRESIDENT MOUL: There's no one else wishing to speak on the bill. So I will recognize Senator Elmer for closing.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Madam President. Very briefly. We've talked a lot about what it's going to cost. There are figures out there available, but it seems like a number of people, and it doesn't matter whether it's people who would like to see the site built or whether they wouldn't, who are reluctant to share those figures. And I agree with Senator Johnson. Over the interim, we're going to learn a lot, and this bill is going to help. I'd ask for your advancement...your help in advancing it.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Elmer. You've all heard the motion to advance LB 748. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 748 is advanced. Speaker Baack, do you wish to be recognized?

SPEAKER BAACK: Yes, Madam President and colleagues, we are going to pass over LB 511. My understanding is there is an amendment being drafted for that so we will pass over that for right now and go to LB 355.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We will start now with LB 355.

CLERK: Madam President, the...I have E & R amendments, first of all, Senator.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 355.
