I concur that Senator Ashford and Senator Schellpeper and others have worked diligently to get this bill in a form that, one, accomplishes one of the goals that I, obviously, had this session which would develop something in our state law that made it at least more enforceable that certain people were not supposed to be able to buy handguns in the State of Nebraska. I think LB 355, as amended, certainly does that. I applaud both Senator Ashford and Senator Schellpeper for coming to that but nevertheless, I guess, I don't think we need to totally erode the spirit of compromise and if you adopt my amendment, I think four years simply makes more sense to me than three years. It's as simple as that. With that, I would ask for adoption of the amendment.
