

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the closing on the Wickersham amendment. We will now vote on that amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We're voting on the Wickersham amendment. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Wickersham's amendment. Mr. President, Senator Schrock would move to amend the Withem amendment. Senator, I've got your AM2287 in front of me. (Schrock amendment appears on pages 2799-2800 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. Speaker, members of the legislative body, in committee I had an amendment to this bill which was adopted by the committee, and it stated that if a landowner put his place of residence in a K-12 district why then any contiguous land would also have to go with that. And that's causing some problems, because some pieces of property that are contiguous can have more than one residence on it. And I had an amendment that dealt with it, but it seems like the easiest thing to do at this time would be to completely just withdraw that amendment that was added in committee. And so that's basically what this amendment does, and I would ask that the body adopt this amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Beutler, on the Schrock amendment. Senator Withem, on the Schrock amendment.

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, Mr. Speaker, very briefly. This is corrective, simple, corrective amendment to the text of the amendment itself. Senator Schrock had a concern in committee regarding how this affiliation might actually operate. I think the purpose for which the amendment was originally added no longer exists, and I think it's a simple little amendment, I think we should support Senator Schrock on it.

SPEAKER BAACK: Anyone else wishing to address the Schrock amendment? Senator Schrock, did you wish to close?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I'll waive closing, Mr. Speaker.
