LB 579

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the motion to suspend the rules to permit reading of LB 579.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion is adopted. We will remind the senators we are on Final Reading. We will proceed with Final Reading on LB 579.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 579 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING

SPEAKER BAACK: Senators, we are on Final Reading. Before we go to a vote, I would like all of the senators to be seated and check in, please. Senators, please report to the Chamber and check in, please. Senators, please return to the Chamber and check in, please. Senator Lindsay, check in, please. Senator Pirsch, check in. Senator Schimek and Senator Schrock. Senators Schimek and Schrock. Senators Schimek and Schrock, please come to the Chamber. Senator Lynch, check in, please. Senator Schimek. All members are now present. All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 579 with the emergency clause attached pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 2821-22 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 16 nays, 2 present and not voting, 5 excused and not voting, on passage of the bill with the emergency clause attached.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 579 does not pass with the emergency clause so we will now vote on LB 579 without the emergency clause. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 2822-23 of the Legislative Journal.) 31 ayes, 12 nays, 1 present and not voting, 5 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 579 passes. We are going to stand at ease for a few minutes until we make sure we have everything back plus 579 has to go up for enrollment since the emergency clause was stricken. So we have to stand at ease for a few minutes.
