On the other hand, I know there is a lot I haven't heard and I can't really make a total commitment on a resolution on a federal issue if I haven't heard all points of view and that's simply cannot happen in the discussion at this level.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Does anyone else wish to address this amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Wesely?

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Madam President. All this amendment does is in this particular section that deals with the different...National Conference of Insurance Legislators, and the National Association of Insurance Commissioners that have been working on state legislative insurance matters, we add National Conference of State Legislatures because the NCSL, which this organization belongs to, has also been working on insurance measures. As a matter of fact, I chair their National Committee on Insurance Solvency, so we want to I think not delete or not miss them from inclusion in this resolution. So I'd ask that this be amended and that group added to the resolution as being involved in this issue.
