I'm the only one that stood up to speak, but hopefully that will...people, I notice, are kind of scratching their heads and wondering what 719 is doing up here. It's up here so we can complete the body's swapping situation that we started yesterday, so I would urge people to withdraw their amendments and I will withdraw this one at this time.
