LB 511, 719

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Lamb. We will now vote on the suspension of the rules. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to suspend the germaneness rule.

SPEAKER BAACK: The rule is suspended.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lamb would move to amend with AM2286. (See page 2865-67 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. As I indicated previously, this is the exact same bill as Senator Conway amended into LB 511, and so with that, I would hope that the body would allow me to amend the bill into 719 so that next year there will be a viable bill there, which I may try to change Senator Conway's amendment a trifle, but, nevertheless, it is there ready to go. I would ask that the amendment be adopted.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Lamb. Discussion, Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: Just once again to repeat, because people are coming in and out and may be wondering what is going on here, this is a motion that puts LB 511 into 719, reverses the swap that took place yesterday. It is a measure of which I am supportive and think the rest of you should be also.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you. I rise to oppose, not definitely the maneuver that took place, I thought that was...I didn't think anything was wrong with that.
