SENATOR HALL: I would so move.

SENATOR WARNER: The amendments are withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, further amendments?

CLERK: Well, Mr. President, Senator Chambers had a motion to reconsider the Bernard-Stevens amendment and it was filed ahead of the second Senator Hall's amendment, so a reconsideration motion is pending.
