Senator Rasmussen and Senator Abboud, return to the Chamber. Senator Rasmussen and Senator Abboud. Senator Abboud, Senator Rasmussen, please return to the Chamber. Have been unable to locate Senator Abboud. Senator Dierks, do you want to proceed? Motion is to adjourn till 9:00 a.m., tomorrow morning. Roll call vote has been requested in reverse order, Mr. Clerk.

PRESIDENT MOUL PRESIDING

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion fails. I will raise the call. We will return to LB 577 discussing the motion to advance the bill. Senator Wesely, followed by Senator Chambers and Nelson.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Madam President and members. I know Senator Dierks was trying to save us a little more time in adjourning, I guess, but if there's a desire to vote on the bill, I'd ask that that vote be a negative one to advancing it. I want to start by thanking Senator Baack for the way he has handled the bill. He pulled it off of the agenda so the time it would take and fight that it would cause would not take time away from other issues this session and, as Speaker, it was his prerogative and he chose, I think wisely, to save this debate for today when perhaps we have a little bit of time. Nevertheless, I continue to oppose this measure. I was actively
