He was raging mad, which I've never seen him, only that one time, and he had in his hand a fax, a bundle of material that had been faxed from an outstate court to the Worker's Compensation Court in Lincoln and he was saying and I don't remember the exact quotes but it was, what in the matter...what in the world is the matter with these young people today? Don't they understand that money is valuable? They could have saved nine dollars and something out of court funds if they had mailed it, which would have given it plenty of time, rather than faxing it which got it the next day. That's the type of person Judge Novicoff is when it comes to the...to the use of the monies that are appropriated for the operation of the Worker's Compensation Court. If he operated as some other agencies give the indication of operating, we would probably be appropriating in the claims bills hundreds of thousands of dollars to try to cover up their mistakes. It doesn't work this way. We're asking to be made whole for \$23,000 for each of the two years. I don't think that, given the nature of the use of this, which is to maintain and upgrade their computer records which are essential to the operation of the Worker's Compensation Court, which are essential to the maintaining of the data base, both for the compensation of insured parties but in the health, safety and welfare of the work force I think that this would be a reasonable override and would encourage your support of this motion. Thank you, Madam President. And if there's any time, if Senator Ashford wanted to...okay, he waives. Thank you.
