PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Rasmussen. We will now vote on the motion to override. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: I ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chambers and record their presence. Senators, please be seated and please check in. The house is under call. Senator Nelson, Senator Hefner, Senator Wickersham, please check in. Senator Labedz. We're looking for Senator Wickersham. Senator Labedz, would you please check in. We will proceed with a roll call vote on the override motion.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2915 of the Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 17 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion fails. I will raise the call.

CLERK: Madam President, the next motion I have is by Senator Lynch. It's a line-item override with respect to the community mental retardation programs.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Madam Chairman and members, this is a little different than some of the rest. There are two MR overrides, as you can see. One is on LB 843 which we're discussing and it applies only to Region 6. I sent around some documents for you to take a quick look at, if you would, please. And what it does is identify federal funding for each region received and the percentage of money that's allocated to each region. LB 1031, 1990, indicated what proportion of funds should be received by each region. I won't read you the whole thing but Region 1 got 7.28 percent; Region 2, 6.23; Region 3, 13.94 percent; Region 4,
