SENATOR WITHEM: Call the question.

SPEAKER BAACK: Do I see five hands? I do. We will now vote on ceasing debate. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on ceasing debate. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

I think contrary to what may have been, as far as whether the amount is large enough to have some impact, I believe it is large enough to have an impact. And I think by replacing the original amount, that it will have the positive effect which is intended, and I think it will have a beneficial impact upon the students in the State of Nebraska. I would urge that we adopt it. It's a \$125,000 item, covers just the first year of the biennium. I'd urge the adoption of the override.
