SENATOR MOORE: ..of letters we've got from the business community in the State of Nebraska, it's one of those things that I think maybe the University Foundation could raise a little money to continue. SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Moore. I had some more questions, but you answered nearly all of them in your stirring presentation. Thank you, Madam President.
