PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Robinson. We'll now vote on the motion to override. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 8 ayes, 19 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Motion fails.

CLERK: Senator Chizek has the next motion, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Chizek.

SENATOR CHIZEK: Madam President, colleagues, I'm going to reluctantly withdraw this amendment. I've watched the votes most of the even and recognize that it's probably...would not do much good to run it. I'm going to make a few comments before I do. It was a little difficult for me to put it up here when...and request this 65,000 dollars for the AFIS program, obviously it being .004 of the General Fund money, to see it vetoed, I guess, somewhat surprised me because it was seed money, but then, by the same token, I guess I'm not surprised when I see funds for respite and handicapped children vetoed. So recognizing that it's probably fruitless, I will withdraw that amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chizek. Next motion, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Chambers would move to override. Senator, this is the economic development money fund in Section 30.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, I hope you will vote with me to override this veto by the Governor. I had no reason to expect to have to make this presentation to you. First of all, the Governor made a recommendation that a million dollars be made available for this program. He recommended it.
