CLERK: 22 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT MOUL: House is under call. All unexcused senators please return to the Chamber and please check in. Would the senators please be seated and please record their presence. Senator Lowell Johnson, Senator Moore, Senator Schmit, Senator Rasmussen, Senator Labedz, Senator Ashford and Senator Wesely. We'll proceed with the roll call vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2925 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 12 nays.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion fails. I will raise the call.
