SENATOR WESELY: Waive.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: (Response inaudible.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Question.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Are there sufficient seconds? There are. We will now vote on the motion to cease debate. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Debate has ceased. Senator Warner, do you have closing? Closing is waived. We will now vote on the motion to reconsider. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 14 nays, Madam President, on the motion to reconsider.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We are on Select File. Senator Warner. On the motion to return to Select File, Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, just very briefly, as I understand the amendment Senator Lindsay offered, and I hope, Senator Lindsay, you are listening, so you can correct me if I am in error. What I believe would be the case, if that is adopted, with the passage of LB 829, that carried a provision in which we continue to use the exemptions on inventory, livestock, and farm equipment, and on that basis, my assumption is, Senator Lindsay, that even with the adoption of your amendment, that is not a new exemption. They will be in place. The only thing that would be a new exemption would be business equipment and some of the other smaller items that were included. So I don't know that there is a whole lot to lose. The 30 vote for new additional exemptions beyond what was in law before LB 829 was enacted will continue, and new ones that come about later will take 30 votes, but I think that is a better compromise if that is what necessary than to do nothing. And, again, I would repeat, the issues will be two separate ballot items. So I would move the recon...what is my motion, Mr. Clerk, is it to
