PRESIDENT MOUL: Return to Select File.

SENATOR WARNER: I move the bill be returned to Select File in order to consider the...reconsider the adoption of the Lindsay amendment.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Madam President, I haven't entered into the debate, but I am guess I am curious. Those senators who stood on the floor here in the last hour and told us that this is bad tax policy to the entire resolution, whether or not those same individuals, at least those 10 that voted against LR 186 just a moment ago, will this necessarily change their vote, because it seems immaterial if it will not, so I pose the question, first of all, to Senator Hall or Senator Withem, since they have been the most outspoken in this area.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President and members. Senator Johnson, in response to the question, this proposal, as I have stated before, will not change my opinion on the resolution, but I am only one of 10 or 12.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Yes, sir, I understand that. I guess I would ask Senator Withem that question.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: I am wrestling with that question at the very moment, Senator Johnson. On the one hand, it doesn't change the underlying philosophy I spoke about before. On the other hand, it may show a signal that the Legislature is willing to begin to get ourselves out of entrenched groups. I am wrestling with it. I do not know how I will vote.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: I guess my last question would be to Senator Chizek.

SENATOR CHIZEK: I made a commitment yesterday that if it went on, I would support the constitutional amendment if that Lindsay
